Consequently, long-distance transmission may not be feasible or experience significant signal loss., It is also possible to connect multiple terminals in series on one optical core, but this requires multiple fusion splicing, which results in large light attenuation and cannot achieve long-distance. A 1-core fiber is like a single-lane road—only one car (or data signal) can travel at a.
